Oil Caps/Dipsticks

Did you know? 182 Flaps


In order to correctly position the flaps in the 182 to a desired extension angle, move the flap control handle so the flap position indicator aligns with the wing flaps position scale.

This is probably obvious to most pilots. However, because the flap control handle does not always line up with the position indicator, I was never sure which should line up with the position scale.

I measured the flap extension with an inclinometer and confirmed that the indicator should line up with the scale and the scale is approximately accurate. This is true for the "up", 10 degree and 20 degree positions. However, at full 40 degree extension the indicator is not fully deflected to the "Full" position on the scale. (See below.)
